

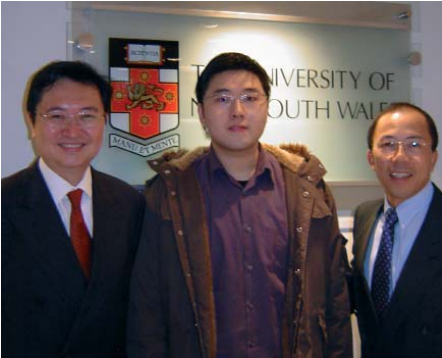

Optometry student wins inaugural Hong Kong alumni scholarship

The UNSW HK Alumni Chapter has announced that Li Wai Tak, a first year Optometry student, is the winner of the inaugural Hong Kong Alumni Scholarship.

Mr Li went to Australia in 2003 to complete the UNSW Foundation Year, a preparation program for undergraduate studies. He achieved excellent results and gained admission to the Bachelor of Optometry degree, which he has just commenced.

The President of the HK Chapter, Rod Houg-Lee, said: "We are proud to have Wai Tak as our scholarship winner. We established the scholarship to give something back to our local community. We want to assist bright and talented HK students to study at our University, and Wai Tak fits this profile. He is hard-working with a sense of enthusiasm about his future."

The Chapter's Vice-President, Barnabas Fung, said: "Our goal is to establish a legacy in the form of an endowed scholarship fund. The scholarship will be offered annually to HK students."

Over the last 18 months the Chapter has raised AUD\$25,000, which was matched by UNSW in 2004.

Further fundraising opportunities will be available in coming months through the UNSW Hong Kong Foundation Ltd. The Foundation is seeking to become an approved charitable body whereby donations will be tax deductible.

UNSW Asia Launch

UNSW is set to become a leading international university with the announcement that its campus in Singapore will be the first wholly owned and operated research and teaching campus to be established by an Australian university overseas. Designed

to reach an enrolment of 15,000 students over 15 to 20 years, UNSW Asia will offer a range of disciplines with standards equivalent to the home campus.

It will be built on a green-fields site at South Changi. The campus will offer a comprehensive range of undergraduate, postgraduate and research degrees and

will include extensive research laboratories. The first students will be enrolled in February 2007.

UNSW's Deputy Vice-Chancellor (International) Professor John Ingleson said that UNSW Asia will be a major research and teaching institution that will be independently governed and run by UNSW. "This sets it apart from most offshore universities which are primarily teaching-only institutions. It is also unique in that there will be no third-party involvement," he said.

"This move to UNSW Asia will take UNSW into the international league of universities and we will leverage off opportunities overseas back into the home campus. An internationalisation policy is absolutely essential - and it must be focused and strategic."
